esign has the power to inspire. That is the belief of Dutch designer Danny Fang who recently undertook a special assignment for local firm Kian Contract Sdn Bhd.

academy in 1998, Fang ventured to Africa where he made crafts at trade fairs, followed by a stint with the **Dutch Association of Applied** Scientific Research. Thereafter, he worked

for six years with world-famous design house Marcel Wanders Studio as its senior

That led this "passionate and impatient" person to quit his job in January last year "because what I was doing didn't satisfy me anyport the great production strength in Asia ... with my Western way of thinking and

designing, I think I can really make a difference here," he

says.
A beneficiary of his presence is Kian Contract, a local furniture company that com-missioned him to design a set of outdoor and indoor chairs.

Inspired by the stackable Russian nested Matryoshka dolls (also known as

Babushka dolls), the way the smaller pieces can be placed inside the

larger ones led Fung to create a chair design that is fun, yet highly functional.

Because a set of Matryoshka chairs compris ing "a papa chair, mama chair and a pair of children's chairs" are made from recyclable extruded polyethylene fibre and welded aluminium frames, they are also environ-mentally friendly, easy-to-main-tain and light, weighing just

22kg in total. "In this collaboration with Kian, I found a great opportu-nity to design products using modern materials, resulting in appealing and durable furniture," says Fang, whose studio also focuses on combining electronics with interior and lifestyle items to produce creations that "excel in beauty and intelligence".

From his chance encounter

with Kian Contract's James Ng that gave rise to "something smart, something sexy and smart, something sexy and something nobody else has done before", Fang went on to design many other furniture pieces, some of which were displayed at the Malaysian International Furniture Fair held in Kuala Lumpur recently. Ask this food and fun-lov-

ing designer for advice to give

aspirants who want to enjoy similar success and he says: "Good design is defined by a solid concept and a proper articulation of that idea.

"I come from a place where there are over 35 political par-ties. Every one in the country

It is the environment, he adds, that stimulates concep-

auds, that standards conceptual thinking.
For now, however, Fang is happy basking in the knowledge that his Matryoshka chair has been able to strike right at the heart of an international design language, appreciated by Malaysians as well.
